



Welcome to Bromsgrove Festival

Since its rejuvenation in 2014, Bromsgrove Festival went from strength to strength, halted only, as so many things were, by the pandemic which resulted in the complete cancellation of the 2020 Festival and a reduction to three street events only in the late Summer of 2021. 2022 saw a resurgence of the Festival in its earlier, more comprehensive, format and it is to be hoped that the event continues its path "onwards and upwards" in future.

The 2023 Festival will continue to focus on the arts, culture and heritage activities in Bromsgrove and will maintain, and hopefully improve upon, the quality of events, albeit that the range and number of those events is, even now, curtailed by some local arts organisations, and indeed some arts individuals, not having fully recovered in the aftermath of the pandemic.....and, of course, the continued closure of Artrix, as a venue and as an arts centre, has a dramatic effect on the programme. The Festival will also continue to sponsor free events including a Day of Music and Dance on Bromsgrove High Street, a concert in the popular Bite Sized Classics series and, in association with Creative Arts Showcase, a fun, family inclusive all-day and evening event in Sanders Park with a host of entertainments, spectacles and activities, including performance, music, art, hands on craft taster workshops, street food, soft drinks and bar.

in addition, the Festival will be staging and promoting events inspired by the Tell Me What You Want survey and report which was concluded immediately before the pandemic struck. Some of these latter events, which are designed to bring the "arts", in the widest definition of the term, to all sections of the community, are still in the planning stage and/or awaiting grants and you are advised to keep an eye on the web site and on social media for a chance to be involved....better still, register to be included on our regular email list via our web site (see next paragraph)
