

Oyez! Oyez! Oyez! Kevin Celebrates 40 years as Town Crier

Can you remember the summer of 1985? Fair Day to be precise. The day marked the beginning of a new era for Bromsgrove, and what a blessing for the town it has been to have Kevin Ward as our wonderful Town Crier since that day to this!

To celebrate the incredible 40 year achievement, Kevin is hosting the Ancient and Honourable Guild of Town Criers National Championship in Bromsgrove on Saturday 14th June. There will be two rounds of crying on the day to identify the National Champion. In the morning, the competition will be in the High Street while the market is on and the street is busy and bustling with people. Each Crier will cry about their hometown. After the formal competition the Criers will stay in the town centre, lunching at local cafes and restaurants, giving shoppers an opportunity to meet them. In the afternoon, the group will move to Avoncroft Museum of Buildings where the second round will take place on the lawns outside Guesten Hall. The two different locations will test the Criers' ability to adapt to different surroundings.

The event has been made possible thanks to support from Bromsgrove Institute Trust, Bromsgrove Festival, Bromsgrove Society, Bromsgrove District Council, Bromsgrove Court Leet, The Elmley Foundation, Cllr Josh Robinson, Cllr Mick Marshall, Cllr David Nicholl, Andrew Harris Trust, Destination Bromsgrove, Bromsgrove Cobblers and Allica Bank. Wythall Transport Museum are providing a vintage bus to move everyone round in style.

About the event Kevin said:

"I'm very pleased to be bringing this important, National Competition to the town to mark 40 very enjoyable years as Bromsgrove's Town Crier. The support I have already received from the organising team and the sponsors is fantastic. I am most grateful to all.

The judging will be based on diction and clarity of the Crier's cry at a suitable sustained volume. I've chosen two venues because the High Street's acoustic is quite reverberant and crowds will be passing for the market, so they'll need to grab people's attention. The Guesten Hall Field is open and acoustically dead, a completely different challenge. These two different spaces will find the best Town Crier!"

It will be a wonderful day in Bromsgrove, and I hope to see plenty of shoppers in the morning and visitors at Avoncroft Museum in the afternoon."
