Come, Sing the Songs of Africa

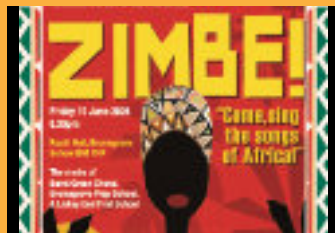
